FAQ – Frequently asked questions

Who can participate in the 50/50 raffle?

Participation is reserved exclusively to people aged 18 and older. Volunteers and Montreal Impact Foundation staff members may not purchase tickets.

How can I purchase tickets?

The sale of these tickets takes place at Stade Saputo for ticket holders.

Payments must be made by cash or by credit card with one of the following cards: Mastercard or Visa. We do not accept AMEX.

How much do tickets cost?

- 1 ticket for \$5
- 3 tickets for \$10
- 15 tickets for \$20
- 40 tickets for \$40

How will I receive my tickets?

Participants will receive a physical copy of their ticket from the vendor carrying out the transaction.



When will raffle tickets be up for sale and when will the winning number be drawn?

Tickets will be on sale an hour and a half before the start time of CF Montréal home games. Since every participant in the 50/50 raffle needs to register their information, a representative from the Foundation will immediately contact the winner. At the same time, the winning number will be announced on the Foundation's website

Where can I find the winning number and what happens if my ticket has the winning number?

The winning number will be shown on the big screens at Stade Saputo and on the Foundation's website. The winner will be contacted by phone and/or email by a Foundation representative once the draw is finished. The winner will have 15 minutes to get to the Montreal Impact Foundation Kiosks under section 132.

How much time does the winner have to claim their prize?

The person whose ticket is selected will have 15 minutes to get to the kiosks under section 132 once the draw is over. They will need to provide two proofs of identity and fill out a declaration and exemption of liability form by email before claiming their prize.

In the eventuality that the winner does not claim their prize in the fifteen minutes following the draw, a new draw will be carried out on the following business day. The new winner will be contacted by telephone and/or email once the new draw is finished.

What is the other half of the grand prize used for?

The funds amassed will benefit the Montreal Impact Foundation, support activities whose goals are to support and improve the quality of life of children and families from underprivileged neighborhoods.



What are my chances of winning?

Your chances of winning depend on the number of tickets sold during the raffle.

Are the raffle tickets tax deductible?

No official receipt will be emitted for tax purposes when purchasing 50/50 raffle tickets, as determined by the Canada Revenue Agency.

Can I get a refund?

All ticket sales are final. No refund will be accorded to and included in the draw cannot be refunded anyone for whatever reason. All tickets purchased, including if the buyer made a mistake while selecting the number of tickets they wished to purchase.
